Splashdown Raft-up 2014 – April 5th

Spring provided two sunny cool days between rain days allowing the early season sailors to convene at Worton Creek's Blind Duck Cove to officially start the 2014 season. The NSHSA Sailors able to complete the launch commissioning sufficiently to bend sail against the wind were:

Saturday's weather was sunny, cool and winds were NW 20 gusting to 30+ knots providing a thrill ride for this first sail of the season. Only a small patch of sail canvas was needed to achieve speeds of 6+ knots.

Narsilion and Silent Running were bound to the hook in the snug safety of Blind Duck Cove anchorage, Champagne took at slip at WCM because of forecasted night temps to drop into the low 30s.

Elsie's Phantasie decided to update their electronic charts at the WC entrance by searching for the newly shoaled areas from the winter storms. They found a shoal just off 'G3' and stayed most of the Saturday night standing watch in four feet of water while the winds continued to howl out of the northwest. BoatUS Tow arrived around 2200 hours to relieve them of their duty. We are considering naming the shoal "Elsie's" in their honor.

Unaware of the excitement taking place at 'G3', the traditional 'Peep' festivities were underway aboard Silent Running and Narsilion. This year's celebration did not include 'Peep Jousting' (AKA Peep Roasting); instead the Peeps were part of a 'Soap Box Derby' Car Build Contest.
